Guide For Accessing Transitioning Youth Services

1. Print and complete DDA application (be sure to keep a copy for yourself)

2. Mail application to appropriate DDA office listed on last page of application with documentation of the disability.

Western Region 1-888-791-0193 (Allegany, Carroll, Frederick, Garrett and Washington Counties)
Southern Region 1-888-207-2479 (Calvert Charles, Montgomery, Prince George's and St. Mary's Counties)
3. Complete face to face eligibility interview. A Service Coordinator, Resource Coordinator and/or DDA staff may complete the interview



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Additional Services for Transitioning Youth:

Apply for services through the Division of Rehabilitation Services (DORS) at the age of 18. DORS may provide job training support and development prior to and after graduation. **www.dors.state.md.us or 1-888-554-0334**

Apply for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) with the Social Security Administration at the age of 18. This information is necessary in order to start DDA funded services in a timely manner. **www.ssa.gov or 1-800-772-1213**

Apply for Medical Assistance at the age of 18. This information is necessary in order to start DDA funded services in a timely manner.
